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

The purpose of **The Connector** is to provide information to the board on a weekly basis to give you insight into the programs, projects and services HCDE provides. Each week, we profile a different program or event and showcase happenings around the department's 15 different divisions.

This week we take a peek inside our Early Childhood Education professional development program. This year, due to COVID, HCDE's Early Childhood Winter Conference is being hosted virtually. This has opened the door to even more attendees, many tuning in from around the world! We are up over 1,000 registrations so far and more keep coming in each day. This is the second largest early childhood conference in Texas and presents an opportunity for PK-2 teachers to gain valuable training in literacy techniques, leadership skills and developmental milestones for our youngest learners. This is always a fun conference with high energy and fabulous presenters. I look forward to seeing it in its virtual form and reading the feedback from participants.

This week was shorter than normal with the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday on Monday. I met with my Executive Leadership Team on Tuesday after which we discussed proposed renovation plans for the Irvington building with the architects. All our projects are moving along, and our goal is to have a board work session about the entire capital improvement plan before the February board meeting. I am excited for you to see the conceptual vision for our new buildings!

On Wednesday we met for the audit committee and our regular board meeting. Thank you for your comments during both meetings. Board Appreciation Month is something we look forward to every year, as we try to come up with new and innovative ways to honor your dedication and service to public education in Harris County. I hope you enjoyed the Board recognition and like the small gifts we packaged for you. We had a lot of fun imagining them and picking them out.

Thursday began with introductory remarks at our Annual Choice Partners Vendor and Member Appreciation Luncheon. This is a great opportunity for me to showcase HCDE's innovation in public education. The event attracts member districts as well as large vendors, like Borden Dairy and allows me to explain that our staff does not get commission, nor do we offer rebates. Rather, profits from the purchasing cooperative are funneled back into our general fund and offset costs, which allows for unique HCDE offerings including Leadership programs that study Civil War battles and strategy with the US Army War College. Profits from Choice also further our ability to leverage the tax rate and offer services and items below cost to school districts. A few of the types of things we can do because of Choice include the inclusive playground and sensory room at AB West, Fortis Academy's commercial kitchen, outdoor learning center and ropes course and the \$500,000 the board transferred to the foundation for scholarships, grants and sponsorships. These are items a traditional school district cannot afford but HCDE is able to provide because of our tax rate, business model and Choice Partners' transfers to the general fund each year. I wrapped up the day planning for our Board Retreat on February 19 and spent Friday at my NPO office where I participated in standing meetings.

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R.T. Garcia Early Childhood Conference to be held online for the first time in its 35-year history

Over 1,000 educators from around the world will participate in the 35th annual R.T. Garcia Early Childhood Winter Conference from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, January 30, 2021.

Despite the pandemic, participation is expected to be high because the conference will be held virtually for the first time ever.

"The positive side of having it online is being able to have an extended reach beyond our county," said HCDE director of special projects for the Teaching and Learning Center Andrea Segraves, who oversees this annual event.


Registration has increased more than 25% over last year with educators from New York to Los Angeles and a number of countries, including the Dominican Republic, China and Qatar signing up to learn the latest trends in early childhood education.

"Hosting this event virtually has allowed us to build partnerships with people from all over," Segraves said. "We are considering hosting this conference in both in-person and virtual formats in the future so that we can continue being a leading resource for educators locally and globally."

Segraves took a different approach to promote this year's conference by turning to LinkedIn. As a result of her efforts, one of this year's presenters is Dr. Kathryn Murray, an Australian-based early childhood education specialist who connected with Segraves on the professional networking platform.

Murray will be presenting her sessions, "Keeping Development of the Brain in Mind when Designing Effective Learning Environments" and "The Role of Parents and Educators in Nurturing Brain Development in the Early Years," from her home in Queensland, Australia.

More than 50 breakout sessions during the one-day event include presentations for educators that focus on the needs of bilingual and special education students, teachers who need help with strategies to address social and emotional learning, and of course, tips for teaching in a virtual environment.

"This is a great opportunity for educators to receive a highquality level of professional development," said Segraves. "We've paid special attention to the kinds of sessions we are offering this year. We want to make sure that the sessions are current and practical in developmentally appropriate activities so that we are meeting the needs of our youngest learners, especially in an online teaching environment."


